The Board of the Nathan L. Anderson Memorial Scholarship Foundation, Inc., completed their calendar year 2012 scholarship award cycles after providing scholarship assistance to seven Oakwood University (OU) students (some of whom are pictured here).

During the Spring 2012 Semester, OU seniors Anne-Laure Cesarin and Samuel Alexandre were the inaugural recipients of the Foundation's scholarship.

Recipients of the Fall Semester 2012 awards are: (music majors) Melonie Callender and Ciara Scott, and (nursing majors) Floyd Fleming, Ashleigh Hoagland and Brianna Pringle. Total scholarship assistance during 2012 from the Foundation to OU students amounted to \$18,500.

In his honor the foundation is structured to support educational institutions that Nathan attended and provide scholarships to support students pursuing college degrees in areas of importance to him: computer science, aviation, nursing and music.

## Grants awarded

During 2012, a second \$ 5,000 grant was provided to the George E. Peters SDA Elementary School in Hyattsville, MD. This followed an initial \$5,000 grant award in December 2011 that was designed as seed money to assist the school in establishing a Science, Technology, Engineering, Technology (STEM) preparatory program to help its student body develop an interest in STEM-related occupations.

The Foundation awarded this total \$10,000 seed grant to position the school to pursue matching grants from other organizations for the purpose of expanding the STEM preparatory program.
